The Holy Spirit, Our Teacher & Guide

The Church has always been guided by the action of the Holy Spirit. In the First Reading we see the Holy Spirit acting through the Apostles. In the early Church it was difficult to decide what Christ wanted of the first Gentile-Christians. Once baptized, what were they, Jews? Should they observe Jewish dietary laws, customs; should they be circumcised? The Apostles met to discern God's will. Though they led the discussion and compromise, they were directed by the Holy Spirit. The Second Reading from Revelation describes the heavenly Jerusalem, a city built out of precious stones, with 12 gates, (the 12 Patriarchs) and the foundation made of 12 courses of stones (the 12 Apostles), i.e., the founders of the Old and New Israel. No temple is seen, for there, God is found everywhere. (At the moment of Jesus' death, when the temple veil was torn in two, the separation between God and man was shattered forever.) Likewise, we find no sun or moon, for the Lord Himself, is the true Light, in Him there is no darkness. In today's Gospel, as in the First Reading, we're being prepared for the Holy Spirit's descent (*Pentecost*). Here, St John speaks of the Paraclete who is to come. The word Paraclete is translated as, Advocate, Consoler, Counselor, Healer, etc. Jesus explains that He must ascend to the Father in order to send us the Holy Spirit. Though this physical separation from Him may be difficult, we should rejoice, for Jesus is doing the Father's will. He foretells His departure and return to the Father, to help us believe. Jesus assures us that His Advocate He will send to take His place, will instruct us, remind us of His teachings, and bring us His peace and healing love.

Pastor's Corner The Diocese has announced that my replacement here at St. John's will be Father Reiner Siva. Father Siva will be coming from St. Joseph Parish in Vacaville. Let us pray for Father that during this transitional time the peace of the God will be in his heart and he will continue the good work of the Lord in our parish.

The Sword of St Michael the Archangel

Archangels are one of the nine choirs of angels. Archangels have unique roles as God's messengers to people at critical times. Among all the angels, they have the most special and protective love for all people and for the earth. The Church recognizes Michael the Archangel as one of the greatest of the archangels. He is an angel, and the leader of all angels and of the army of God . He is the guardian of the Church, as well as the patron saint of police officers, grocers, mariners, and paratroopers. In our Catholic tradition, St. Michael has four duties: 1) To combat Satan. 2) To escort the faithful to heaven at their hour of death. 3) To be a champion of all Christians, and the Church itself. 4) To call men from life on Earth to their heavenly judgment. Christian iconography depicts St. Michael as a knight-warrior, wearing battle armor, and wielding a sword or spear, while standing triumphantly on a serpent or other representation of Satan.

There is an imaginary line "Sword of St. Michael," that links seven different monasteries from Ireland to Israel. Most of these places are associated with apparitions of St. Michael the Archangel. Each location is dedicated to St. Michael and some sources claim it "represents ... the blow the Saint inflicted [on] the Devil, sending him to Hell."

- 1. Skellig Michael, Ireland
- 2. Saint Michael's Mount, England3. Mont Saint Michel, France
- 4. Sacra di San Michele, Italy
- 5. Sanctuary of Monte Sant'Angelo, Italy
- 6. Symi's Monastery, Greece
- 7. Stella Maris Monastery, Mount Carmel, Israel

Each monastery was built separately, at different times and by different monks. The seven shrines stand at great distances from each other, but are perfectly aligned. There was absolutely no intention of creating a line between them all. The Sacred Line also is perfectly aligned with the sunset on the day of the Northern Hemisphere's Summer Solstice. The three most important sites, Mont Saint Michel in France; Sacra di San Michele in Italy; and the Sanctuary of Monte Sant' Angelo, Italy are all the same distance one from the other.

Pope Leo XIII composed the Prayer to St. Michael in the 19th century, prescribed it to be said at the end of all Low Masses throughout the Christian world. It remained in place until the reforms of Vatican II. In 1994, Saint John Paul II called for a renewal of the devotion. "Although today this prayer is no longer recited at the end of Mass," he said, "I ask everyone not to forget it, and to recite it to obtain help in the battle against the forces of darkness and against the spirit of this world." Pope Francis has called on the entire Church to pray the St. Michael prayer at the end of the Rosary and invoke his intercession against the attacks of the devil. Many bishops throughout the world have reinstated the St. Michael prayer at the end of Mass as well.

The Prayer to St. Michael is a powerful devotion that we can turn to for help, not only at the end of Mass, but in many different circumstances in everyday life. And when St. Michael is on our side, the enemy is defeated (Rev 12:7-9). As Pope Francis said in 2013, when he consecrated Vatican City to the Archangel's protection, "St. Michael wins, because in him there is God who acts."

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle; be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do you, O prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan and the other evil spirits who prowl about the world for the ruin of souls.
