

### God's Kingdom Begins Here & Now

The First Reading reports on the Church's progress in early times. St Paul reminds us that as Christians we must undergo many hardships in witnessing to the Faith. Though very few of us will ever be arrested or martyred for being Christian, we all have a price to pay if we truly witness to the Faith in word and deed. The Apostles always attribute all their mission's success to God. This is essential; for it's easy to be prideful when things go well. The humble recognition of God as the Source of every good, furthers their success. In the Responsorial Psalm, the theme of God's love relationship with man and our's with Him, begins to unfold and continues through the Second Reading and the Gospel. Psalm 145 is a hymn of praise. God's kingdom is best understood as His reign (more an action than an object). It exists whenever and wherever God's law is obeyed and His love revealed. God's reign is one of love and He conquers with His love, for He is the King of all hearts. The Second Reading describes what awaits us after death; the new life, where we are not subject to the limitations of time and the world we now live in. Even our love for God and others will have no limitation. God has taught us love's true meaning. His love for us and our love for Him will be perfect in Heaven. This Heaven is not so much a time or place, as it is a relationship, with God and others. In John's Gospel we see that *glory* means to live in love. Jesus has proven Himself to be the fullness of God's love in His willingness to leave His Heavenly abode, become one of us, and then die on the cross for us. This astounding lesson in love is our challenge. In as much as we love God and one another, we are like Him, for God is love. Love is the basis and totality of the law. When we live in love, we live in God, and God in us. So His reign, His Kingdom, begins here and now with His love and our living it.



Vanier was born in 1928 in Geneva to Canadian parents, and went to study in Canada, England and France. He studied at the Royal Naval College at Dartmouth. He spent time with both the British Royal Navy and the Royal Canadian Navy. In 1945, he visited his father in Paris who was then serving as the Canadian Ambassador to France, here he saw first-hand the horrors of the Holocaust as he and his mother volunteered to assist concentration camp survivors. He resigned his commission in 1950. "The navy was no longer the place for me; I wanted to devote myself to works of peace," he said. He studied philosophy at the Institut Catholique de Paris, completing a doctoral thesis on Aristotle's approach to ethics and human happiness. He taught philosophy at the University of St. Michael's College, Toronto. Moved by a desire to do "something else," he abandoned academia and he traveled back to France in 1963.

Through friendship with a French priest, who was chaplain of a French institution for men with mental and intellectual disabilities, Vanier visited a psychiatric hospital on the outskirts of Paris. Shocked by the violence, despair and loneliness he found Vanier did not merely adopt the cause of the intellectually disabled; he decided to buy a dilapidated house and lived with two people with severe intellectual disabilities. "Essentially, they wanted a friend," Vanier said. "They were not very interested in my knowledge or my ability to do things, but rather they needed my heart and my being." By living with them, Vanier said, he began to understand what it meant to be human. "Before meeting them, my life had been governed largely from my head and my sense of duty. They brought out the child in me. I began to live from my heart." His home launched the L'Arche movement. The first L'Arche house, and soon a community, was formed around friendship, a common table, common chores, common celebrations, and common faith. Disabled and able-bodied could live side by side as equals. They could live, work and care for each other with dignity. Within a few years, Vanier opened similar households nearby, and he sought help from others: young people, from France, Canada, England, and Germany. L'Arche became 154 communities with more than 10,000 members and has spread to more than 37 countries. Those without intellectual disabilities; known as "assistants" spend a year or more committed to a L'Arche home and its disabled members. Vanier found that his work was transformative not only for people with disabilities but also for their assistants. "When those ingrained in a culture of winning and of individual success really meet them, and enter into friendship with them, something amazing and wonderful happens. They too are opened up to love and even to God. They are changed at a very deep level. They are transformed and become more fundamentally human." "Before being Christians or Jews or Muslims, before being Americans or Russians or Africans, before being generals or priests, rabbis or imams, before having visible or invisible disabilities, we are all human beings with hearts capable of loving", he said.

Jean Vanier wrote more than 30 books and was awarded a number of honors including the Order of Canada, the French Legion of

Honour, the Pacem in Terris Award and the Templeton Prize. He became a sought after speaker. He was a member of the Pontifical Council for the Laity and a regular visitor and correspondent with Pope St. John Paul II. He co-founded the Faith and Light movement, an ecumenical Christian association of prayer and friendship for those with intellectual disabilities and their families. Faith and Light has spread to roughly 80 countries.
