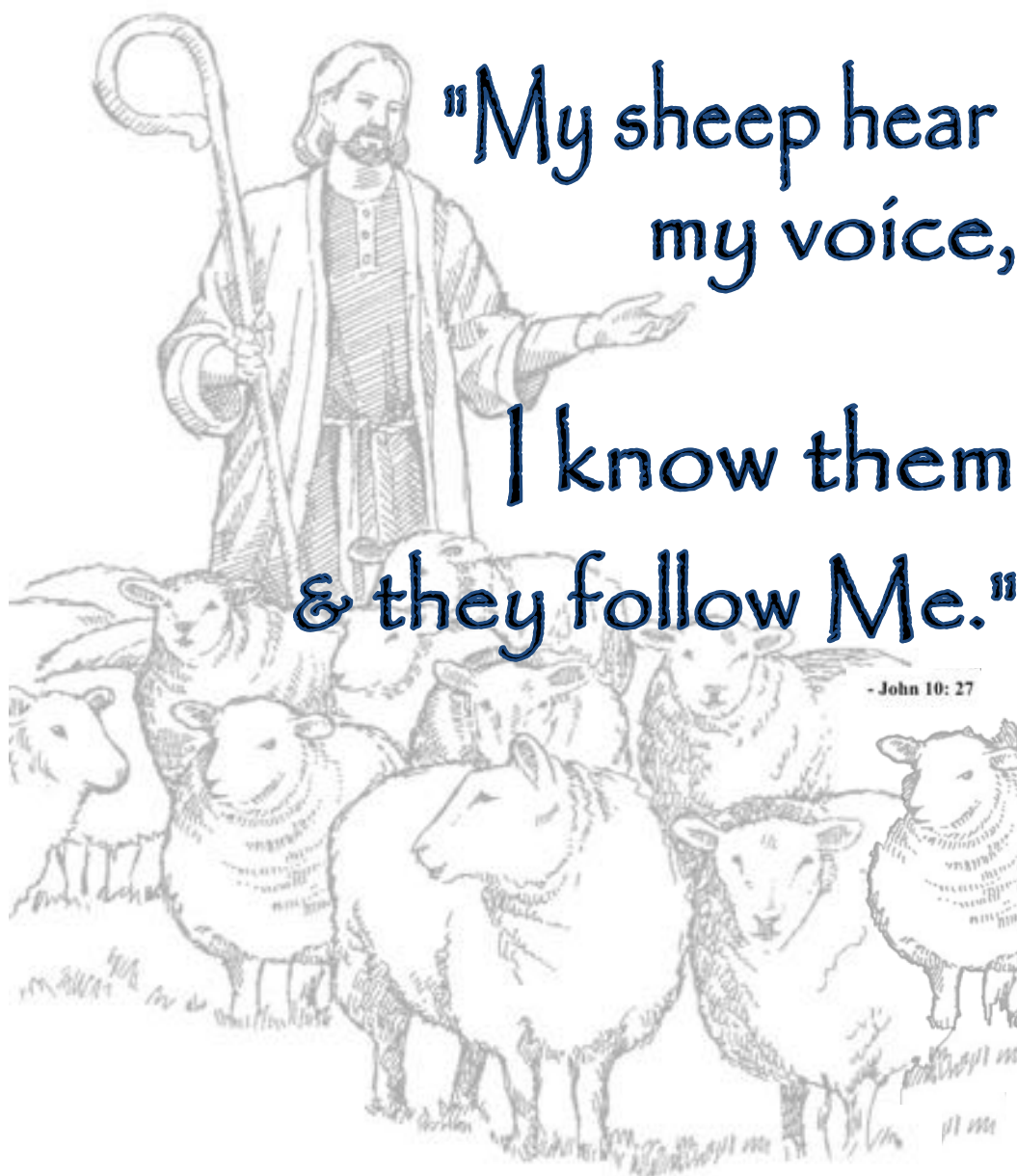

Jesus, Our Shepherd; We, His Flock

Jesus begins His triumphant entrance into Jerusalem on a *colt*, as prophesied by the Prophet Zechariah. **In the First Reading**, we find St Paul turning to the Gentiles to deliver the Good News. The Jews only listened for a while, then became jealous, and rejected him. In fact, they became so furious, they incited others against the Apostles until they were all expelled from the city. The Apostles gladly suffered for the Faith, for then they were participating in Christ's suffering. Meanwhile, the Gentiles eagerly listened to the *(Kerygma) preaching of the Good News*. Though the Apostles were run out of town, a small Christian community was left behind in the Gentiles. We are blessed with St Paul's letters to the different Gentile communities. He regularly wrote to these new Christians to nourish and encourage them, and now us, in the Faith. **The Responsorial Psalm**, like the Gospel, celebrates Jesus as our Good Shepherd, we as His flock. We are not left to struggle through life by our own devices, Jesus sends His Holy Spirit to guide us in our every action. We're blessed with a loving Shepherd who guides us with kindness and gentleness. His love and goodness are limitless, extending to every time and nation. **In today's Gospel**, Jesus identifies Himself as the Good Shepherd. He proclaims this not on His own authority, but by the Father's, for He obeys His Father's will. **The Second Reading** casts a shadow of the cross on today's Gospel, for as His sheep we are purchased and made clean by the Blood of the Lamb. So, by the Almighty Father's power and the shedding of His Son's blood for us, we sheep belong to the Shepherd and shall not be snatched away.

Pastor's Corner



You may have noticed a new, small statue to the right of the statue of Our Lady just in front of the baptismal font. I brought this statue back with me from my recent trip to Poland. It is a statue of the Risen Lord with his hand in the gesture of a blessing. He is also holding a banner which symbolizes His victory over death, over sin and over the devil. It is a tradition in many churches that the faithful like to have an additional reminder of the Resurrection during the Easter time.

I would like to again invite all parishioners to participate this **Monday, May 13 at 6:30**, in the procession and Mass honoring Our Lady of Fatima. Our Lady had entrusted to the 3 children the message of hope and peace. She requested penance, prayer and devotion to her Immaculate Heart. Please pray the Rosary daily as she had requested of the children.

Please welcome to St. John's, **Sr. Victoria Oleka** who will be speaking at this weekend's Masses on behalf of the *Congregation of the Daughters of Divine Love*. Through our diocese's annual Missionary Cooperative Appeals missionaries from other countries visit our local parishes and help build awareness to the needs of Catholics from around the world particularly those from poor countries where Catholics are persecuted for their Faith.

Today, we honor all mothers on this **Mother's Day**. Through the intercession of our own Blessed Mother Mary may they all feel the blessing and loving embrace of her Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ.



Commonly referred to as *Good Shepherd Sunday*. Inspired by the Lord's instruction in the Gospels of *Matthew 9:38* and *Luke 10:2*, in which Jesus exhorts the people to "ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest," World Day of Prayer for Vocations unites the faithful together in praying for the fostering of all vocations, particularly those of ordained ministry and consecrated life.

In his Message for the 2019 World Day of Vocations, **Pope Francis** reflected on the reality that all men are made "bearers of a promise" and are asked to have the "courage to take a risk" with Jesus and for Jesus. The Holy Father emphasized that just as the Lord beckoned Simon and Andrew to leave their nets and follow him, he also asks the same of us. He encounters each of us personally and uniquely, and it is in the midst of this encounter with Christ that Pope Francis says we are granted "the promise of a joy capable of bringing fulfillment to our lives." The Holy Father also urged those discerning to remember that "the Lord's call is not an intrusion of God in our freedom; it is not a "cage" or a burden to be borne. On the contrary, it is the loving initiative whereby God encounters us and invites us to be part of a great undertaking."

Pope Francis beseeched young people to realize that following Jesus is always worth the risk. "Do not be deaf to the Lord's call," he urged. "If he calls you to follow this path, do not pull your oars into the boat, but trust him. Do not yield to fear, which paralyzes us before the great heights to which the Lord points us. Always remember that to those who leave their nets and boats behind, and follow him, the Lord promises the joy of a new life that can fill our hearts and enliven our journey."

The impact of the fire on the faithful of the city and of the world is immense. The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC, has set up a fund to help the Cathedral resurrect and rebuild. All proceeds received will be used solely for the assistance of Notre Dame Cathedral and those affected by this tragedy.
