

Divine Mercy Sunday

The Responsorial Psalm reminds us that this is a time of mercy and gratitude, especially because this is Divine Mercy Sunday. We celebrate the fact that Jesus took our sins upon Himself, suffered and died for us, not because we deserved it, but because we needed it. So God, out of immense love for us, did for us what we could not do for ourselves, by acting on our behalf, and attende for our offense. His death and resurrection conquered sin, death and alienation. This was a real act of mercy and love, so we are filled with incredible gratitude. Crucified in the crack of the stone of Golgotha, the stone rejected by the builders, Jesus again shows Himself to be the fulfillment of that part of Psalm 118, for now He (the stone rejected by the builders) has become the Cornerstone of the "new building", i.e., God's Kingdom. The Gospel recounts two encounters with the Risen Jesus. In the first encounter we see Jesus greet His disciples breathing on them and saying, "Peace be with you". When God created Adam, He breathed into a lump of clay and made it into a living human being. God's own breath, His Holy Spirit, is breathed into us at Baptism. When we sin we reject that Breath. In Reconciliation, Jesus recreates that Breath, His Spirit within us, enabling us to be instruments of His love and mercy. The second account, reminds us that we can trust and believe in the risen Jesus, for we see Thomas, who did not initially believe, but after physically putting his hand into the Savior's hand and side wounds, recognized Our Lord and God. Here we are assured that we can freely believe that Jesus is indeed the second person of the Blessed Trinity, for He truly rose body and soul. He is truly alive, and this belief makes us truly alive in Him.

Act of Consecration to Jesus - The Divine Mercy

Almighty and Eternal Father, we, the members of St. John the Baptist Parish, consecrate ourselves to You through Jesus – The Divine Mercy.

Merciful Jesus, we proclaim You King of Mercy, and we enthrone Your sacred image in our parish church as an act of love and trust. It is our response to Your desire that souls know You as The King of Mercy, and venerate Your sacred image as The Divine Mercy, throughout the world. May it be a constant reminder to us of Your Loving and Merciful Promises, and of our responsibility to be merciful to one another.

Strengthen our faith, deepen our trust, and increase our love for You and each other. Draw us into Your Merciful Heart, that we may never doubt that You are Omnipotence, Wisdom and Goodness Itself, and so worthy of our utmost trust. Give us the grace to live totally in the present moment, with patience and complete abandonment to Your Will and Providence, neither dwelling on the past, nor living in fear of the future.

In Your tender mercy, help us to be reconciled with You and with one another, that hurts and unforgiveness may not stand in the way of our being *transformed*, so that Your mercy might shine through us in our families, our community and our world by our actions, words and prayers. *Sanctify* us with Your Precious Blood and refresh us with the life-giving Water which flow from Your wounded Heart.

Come, Holy Spirit, *inspire*, *guide and teach* us in these times of doubt and confusion. Give us courage, strength and perseverance in prayer. We are confident that You are always with us and our parish, and that through this consecration You will bring about the Reconciliation, the Healing and the Peace promised to those who place their whole trust in Our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Come Merciful Lord Jesus! Renew our hearts. Restore our Parish family. Amen.

Flu restrictions; restoration of the common cup

Many have asked when the flu restrictions will be lifted. The Diocese bases its decision on the influenza surveillance report issued by the California

Department of Public Health (CDPH) each Friday. According to the latest report:

- •Flu activity is decreasing but remains elevated and "widespread" in California.
- •Several more weeks of flu activity are expected.
- •The restrictions will be lifted when Influenza-like illnesses (ILIs) have dropped below the critical threshold of two standard deviations above baseline for two consecutive
- •Restrictions to remain in place for a few more weeks.






