Gospel Meditation

When earthly lives end, especially when the person is younger, we tend to focus upon and consider what was lost. We think of lost opportunities — things they won't be able to see, babies they won't be able to cradle, and adventures that now must go undiscovered. Our minds create this chasm between earth and heaven that sees the losses of this life as permanent ones, never possible to achieve again. This perception causes many folks to remain stuck in their grief as they ponder all of the missed opportunities and regrets.

This is not resurrection thinking. All of the love that we can give and receive, the joy and elation that can be experienced, the adventures that can be undertaken, and the possibilities to be discovered are all part of a continuous journey. They are not ends in and of themselves but are all part of the unfolding of a relationship we have with God, who not only makes all of these wonderful things possible now but sustains them and fulfills them into eternity. The perception and experience of loss is really an illusion, because in God's eternal kingdom and in God's time, nothing is ever lost. Even the most intimate and tender of moments we can conceive of sharing with another human being are only part of a journey toward perfect intimate and tender moments to be shared with God in our resurrected life. We become like God and see God as He is in eternity. What greater joy, love, and hope can ever be discovered as we walk down our often dimly lit paths in this world.

This is an awesome wonder and magnificent news to behold. Call to mind someone you have lost in death. How do you see them now? How do you see yourself in heaven? Remind yourself, again, that God is the Way, the Truth and the Life. Our happiness is not going to be fully realized in this world, and there is nothing we can find here that cannot be found one hundred fold in eternity. It's all about relationship, and not solely about the relationships we have with each other, ourselves, and the world in which we live. It's about our relationship with God. If we realize how special that one relationship really is, then there is only one particular of heaven and life eternal that really matters: namely, that we fall into love eternal and discover truth. For when we finally close our eyes in death, then all will be well as long as we are with God. There are no losses, only gains.

Scripture Reflections

In today's reading, Luke offers an example of the cultural tensions that existed in the early Church between the Hellenists (Gentiles) and the Hebrews (Jews). The resolution resided in offering service to the other. Why do you think service can be a key to resolving community conflict?

Second Reading

Peter emphasizes the importance of faith in Christ for building a strong spiritual house. How has the gift of faith strengthened your home?

Gospel Reading

In his farewell discourse, Jesus encourages the disciples, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father." What inspires you in times of spiritual doubt?

Armed Forces Day is celebrated on the third Saturday in May. Originally, there were single day celebrations for each branch of the military, the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force and Space Force; this format changed on August 21, 1949. Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of Armed Forces Day. Stemming from the unification of the Armed Forces under the Department of Defense, the annual celebration now commemorates all branches of the military during one solitary day. The first Armed Forces Day was celebrated on Saturday, May 20, 1950. Unlike Veterans Day, which honors those who served, and unlike Memorial Day, which honors those who died serving, Armed Forces Day is a day to honor all of the men and women currently serving as well as those who have served, both active and former military.

Letter from Pope Francis to the Faithful for the Month of May 2020

(April 25, 2020)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The month of May is approaching, a time when the People of God express with particular intensity their love and devotion for the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is traditional in this month to pray the Rosary at home within the family. The restrictions of the pandemic have made us come to appreciate all the more this "family" aspect, also from a spiritual point of view.

For this reason, I want to encourage everyone to rediscover the beauty of praying the Rosary at home in the month of May. This can be done either as a group or individually; you can decide according to your own situations, making the most of both opportunities. The key to doing this is always simplicity, and it is easy also on the internet to find good models of prayers to follow.

I am also providing two prayers to Our Lady that you can recite at the end of the Rosary, and that I myself will pray in the month of May, in spiritual union with all of you. I include them with this letter so that they are available to everyone. (*Please note due to space only Prayer One is include below. Prayer Two can be found at the article source listed below*)

Dear brothers and sisters, contemplating the face of Christ with the heart of Mary our Mother will make us even more united as a spiritual family and will help us overcome this time of trial. O Maru.



Inspiration of the Week


What do you imagine the resurrected life of heaven to be like? When we try to get our minds around such an enormous concept, we can easily find ourselves at a loss. For some folks, the enormity of the question actually causes them to ignore the reality of heaven or even conclude that it does not exist. Jesus knew that the magnitude and grandeur of eternal life are really too much for us to grasp. He kept it simple and described it in terms of relationship. The disciples treasured their relationship with Jesus, and he assured them, "Where I am you also may be." Ultimately, that was enough for them to know. They would be with him. Strengthen your relationship with God as He is the way, the truth, and the life. Is the assurance that you will be with Him enough for you as well?

Witnesses for Jesus

This journey of faith is not always easy. Sometimes the greatest wounds are those we suffer when family members and friends wander away from God and leave us behind. The faith they had when they were younger is now strained, or they see the daily walking with Jesus to be too difficult. For them, Jesus becomes what Peter wrote about when he described Jesus as the stone that causes people to stumble and the rock that makes them fall. Our journey is hard enough, but watching a loved one stumble and fall is heart-breaking.

What are we to do in such a situation? Most importantly, we pray. We must realize that God is more powerful than us, and even if we can't make them see the truth, He can. Then we witness to the transformative power of Jesus by our own lives. We need to serve him in word and deed. We should let a joy of being a disciple enlighten our faces. Allow Jesus to work through us so that others may be drawn to him. Lastly, we must never lose hope. Many have walked long journeys alone only to find God far down the road. What will it take to bring someone to Christ? It might be an action, a word, or an emotion. We never know how certain people will be touched. That loved one is a gift from God in your life. Place them back in God's hands, and let Him pick them up if they have stumbled and fallen.

Saint Corona, Who Is She? Feast Day: May 14

Little is known about the young woman who was killed presumably in the second century A.D. But now, a pandemic is shedding light on her: St Corona. Corona is believed to have been killed by Romans in Syria when she was 16 years old for proclaiming belief in Christianity. She witnessed the brutal punishment of Victor, a Roman Christian solider and decided she needed to comfort the dying man. She hurried to him, knelt beside him, and began to pray for him. According to tradition, she had a vision of two crowns floating toward them from heaven, one for Victor and the other for her. When she announced her vision and declared Victor blessed, she was also condemned. "Corona" is Latin for "crown." The coronavirus is so-called because, under a microscope, it looks

like a globe with little globules, resembling a crown. She herself died in a gruesome manner. Bound to two palm trees that were tied to the ground; when the trees were untied, they sprang apart, ripping her body in half. She is also considered the patron saint of lumberjacks.

She began to be honored starting in the sixth century in northern and central Italy. She is revered in Germany's southern state of Bavaria and in Austria. Corona's relics, brought to Aachen by King Otto III in 997, were kept in a tomb underneath a slab in the cathedral. In 1911-12 they were placed in a shrine. Aachen Cathedral, built by Emperor Charlemagne in the ninth century, is one of Europe's oldest. Charlemagne was buried there in 814 and it was used for the coronation of German kings and queens. St. Corona was not technically named the patron of pandemics. According to Catholic.org, she is sometimes "invoked in connection with superstitions involving money, such as gambling or treasure hunting." Gregory the Great, Roch, and Sebastian are all listed in Catholic.org's index as patron saints of plagues, Robert Bellarmine is the patron saint of contagious disease and Godeberta is the patron saint of epidemics. The faithful look at her name, and the location of her buried remains in northern Italy; the center of the Italian pandemic. For believers, that is more than coincidence, and they see something deeper than simple chance. That said, just because Corona hasn't historically been considered a patron saint of disease doesn't mean that she can't be now. Unlike the process of becoming a saint, there's no official protocol for being named a patron saint of any given subject. "Patron saints are often chosen today because an interest, talent, or event in their lives overlaps with the special area." Now St. Corona's name and protection is recognized by many Catholic faithful around the world. Michael Naughton, of the University of St. Thomas, said that, while Corona's experience had little to do with pandemics, still she was the ultimate example of how we should act when caught in one. "Do we go out and buy as much toilet paper as we can," he asked the Star Tribune, "or do we show love for one another as she had offered consolation to a suffering man? If St. Corona can help us do that, let's use it." As Harry Brent of the Irish Post has said, "We've all heard of fighting fire with fire. I guess it's now time to fight corona with Corona" St. Corona Pray for Us


