Gospel Meditation

Can you imagine if Jesus threw a party? From the wedding feast at Cana, we know he wouldn't let the wine run out. From this Sunday's Gospel, we know there would be quite a lively array of guests! We also knew who the most important people would be — everyone. Jesus advises throwing a party that turns everything upside down. Everyone should assume they're the least important attendee, and the guest list shouldn't include the neighborhood "who's who." Rather, we should go looking for "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind" and hope they RSVP. Jesus describes a particular posture towards our own hospitality.

Parties are about the other people. "Do not recline at table in the place of honor." How often can small talk become a one-upmanship of job promotions, home renovations, and our children's achievements? We've all been to parties where being the most interesting guest is the highest achievement. Yet so often, we know the best party guests are the ones who listen well to our stories. Whether we are guests or hosts, we have the opportunity to look on others with humility and awe.

Parties are opportunities to serve. Jesus advises us to be careful who we invite "in case they might invite you back and you have repayment." Does Jesus literally mean we shouldn't invite our friends over? Of course not! But he does invite us to special consideration when we offer hospitality. When we invite people over to our home, what motivates us? Who we want to spend time with? Who we'd like to impress? These ultimately have only ourselves in mind. How about asking: Who could use some extra care right now? Who could benefit from a fun evening out? In other words, who can I serve?

St. John the Baptist Church

Folsom has the unique distinction of being one of the earliest parishes to be established by Archbishop Alemany of San Francisco in the northern part of the state. In 1851 a young Catholic priest, Father John Ingoldsby, traveling by mule began visiting area gold mining camps to bring spiritual relief to the miners. This trip found him going as far afield as Shasta County and back to Sacramento; on the way he held the first ever mass to be celebrated in Folsom.

Talk of building railroads to assist in getting people and goods to the mines can be traced back as far as 1852. Actual construction of the first railroad line in California took place in 1855 when Theodore Judah completed the Sacramento Valley line between Sacramento and Folsom, a distance of 22 miles. Judah, saw that a line extending in its initial stages to the foothills of the Sierras would provide fast and easy transportation to the Comstock mines in the Washoe territory. It was he who was to bring about the actual start of the Central Pacific and who surveyed the line across the Sierras.

With railroad completion in February 1856, Folsom became the terminus of the stage lines across the mountains and a chief transportation center for the mines. Livery stables, blacksmith shops, eating establishments soon cropped up. Priests from Sacramento would make regular trips to deliver services to Folsom and surrounding communities. The nearest priest was the pastor of St. Rose in Sacramento, Father John Quinn, who saw the need for a house of worship and saw in the railroad a quick and easy means of transportation. A mission church was begun in 1856. The next year the Archbishop donated \$115 to purchase land for a permanent church in Folsom. That same year St. John the Baptist Church was born.

Two years later, the Archbishop established Folsom as a separate parish and appointed Father Joseph Gallagher as the founding pastor. The original church at the corner of Natoma and Sibley streets is the oldest surviving building in Folsom and is the oldest church still in use in the diocese. It served as Folsom's only Catholic Church for a century.

In 1957, the anniversary of the building of the old church, a drive was held and a new church across the street was erected. This church was home to the parish from 1959 to January 1990. The present church at Montrose Drive began serving parishioners in 1992. Today it continues to serve over 4000 parishioners.
